HELPFUL TRASH REMINDER

In an effort to reduce or eliminate potential trash related problems at Kingsview Ridge, this reminder is to help acquaint you with the appropriate disposal methods.

REGULAR TRASH COLLECTION:



• Regular trash collection days are **Mondays and Thursdays**.

EXCEPT that <u>NO COLLECTIONS</u> WILL BE MADE ON:

MEMORIAL DAY	INDEPENDENCE DAY
LABOR DAY	THANKSGIVING DAY
CHRISTMAS DAY	NEW YEARS' DAY.

Collection after these holidays will be made on the **NEXT REGULAR COLLECTION DAY.**

• The collection point for trash is:

The curb nearest the front of your home.

- Please do not place your trash out in public view prior to 6:00pm the night before trash collection. Trash containers are not permitted to remain in public view except on days of trash collection.
- Trash should be kept in tightly **sealed** containers.
- PLEASE DO NOT PLACE HAZARDOUS MATERIALS SUCH AS PAINT, OILS, OR OTHER SIMILAR ITEMS IN THE TRASH! It is against Montgomery County law to dispose of such items in the regular trash. Individual owners/residents must dispose of these materials at the County Transfer Station in Gaithersburg or at those special collection points advertised by the County.

BULK TRASH COLLECTION:

If you would like to place bulk trash out for collection, such as; furniture, television, etc... please call the trash company, Potomac Disposal, 301-294-9700, several days prior to placing it out at the curb on a regular collection day.

RECYCLING COLLECTION:

• The regular recycling collection day is **Wednesday**.



- The collection point for recycling is the curb at the front of each home.
- Recyclables must be placed in the "blue bin" provided by Montgomery County.

If you need a "blue bin", call Montgomery County DPWT at (240)777-6410.

- * Yard Waste: must be in a <u>paper</u> bag or tied in a bundle no greater than 18" long.
- Newspapers: must be in a paper bag or tied in a bundle.
- Glass bottles and jars:
 EXAMPLE: Soda, juice, beer and wine bottles, salad dressing, pickle, mayonnaise jars, etc.
- * Aluminum and tin cans: EXAMPLE: Soda, beer and juice cans, pet food, tuna and vegetable cans, including CLEAN aluminum foil products such as TV dinner trays, pie plates and aluminum foil wrap.
- Certain plastic "bottles": with a 1 or 2 recycling symbol on the bottom.
 EXAMPLE: Milk, soda, water and juice bottles, dish soap, laundry detergent and bleach bottles.
- You Should:
 - * EMPTY AND RINSE all containers to be recycled.
 - * **DISCARD** the caps and lids.
 - * STORE recyclables in a designated container <u>out of public</u> view.
